Dear Senator Alexander and Senator Murray:

The undersigned organizations applaud you both for undertaking bipartisan work on a legislative package to stabilize and strengthen the individual health insurance marketplace.

We collectively represent consumers, families, providers, health care and social service professionals, criminal justice professionals, advocates, and allied organizations that are committed to advancing meaningful and comprehensive policies that reduce the toll of substance use disorders and mental illness through prevention, treatment, and recovery support services. We offer the below recommendations with a unique focus on how specific provisions of your legislation would affect individuals with substance use disorders and mental illness.

As you develop a market stabilization framework, we respectfully ask that benefit protections for mental health and substance use disorder treatment and recovery support services through the exchanges and individual/small group markets be maintained and that those benefits be offered consistent with the Mental Health Parity and Addiction Equity Act (MHPAEA).

We have serious concerns about proposals to loosen the Affordable Care Act's (ACA) Section 1332 waiver requirements and thereby allow states to waive key consumer protections such as the Essential Health Benefit (EHB) requirements. Moreover, if states are allowed to modify benefit design and/or allow flexibility between EHB categories, we request that the legislation state explicitly that a comprehensive addiction and mental health treatment benefit must be maintained and compliant with MHPAEA.

We raise these concerns based on our historical experience with exclusions and limitations placed on substance use disorder and mental health benefits by insurers. Prior to the ACA, 34% of enrollees in the individual market did not have coverage for substance use disorder treatment, and 18% did not have coverage for mental health services. Moreover, the Congressional Budget Office (CBO) confirmed in its May 2017 report on the American Health Care Act that these services are most likely to be excluded. CBO states, "Services or benefits likely to be excluded from the EHBs in some states include maternity care, mental health and substance abuse benefits, rehabilitative and habilitative services, and pediatric dental benefits. In particular, out-of-pocket spending on maternity care and mental health and substance abuse services could increase by thousands of dollars in a given year for the nongroup enrollees who would use those services."

We thank you again for undertaking a deliberative consensus-based process for developing stabilization legislation. In the midst of the opioid misuse and overdose epidemic and the suicide epidemic, protecting equitable access to substance use disorder and mental health treatment will undoubtedly save lives. We stand ready to serve as a resource for you as this process moves forward.
